Practical Nursing Program Fall Semester 2025 (August 2025) Competitive Admission Procedures

For admission into the occupational courses of the SRTC Practical Nursing Program, requirements as outlined by the College must be met. Admission to the program is competitive. Please note that compliance with the admission criteria does not guarantee admission. Admission requirements and criteria are institutionally developed and applied by the college's Admissions department to select those candidates for admission as described. Applicants are ranked according to the competitive admission criteria, and the top twenty-five candidates will be admitted to the Fall Semester 2025 (August 2025) cohort. Deadline for the August 2025 class is Thursday, May 22, 2025.

Acceptance/Denial letter emails will be sent out Wednesday, June 25, 2025.

SRTC Admissions Requirements:

1. Submit a SRTC admission application and pay the one-time \$25 application fee. Applications are available online the college website by clicking the blue box marked "APPLY NOW" or using the following: https://mysouthernregional.force.com/apply. Only applications for the fall semester – Thomasville PN program or Tifton PN program will be considered for acceptance into the occupational PN courses at that time.

2. Submit proof of age. (Must be 18 years or older at the time of program entry). Either a valid state driver's license or birth certificate is acceptable.

3. Submit **official** transcripts from high school, high school diploma/HISET/GED® **AND all** colleges and/or technical colleges (transferrable credit or not) mailed to the SRTC Registrar's Office; Southern Regional Technical College, 800 Veteran's Parkway North, Moultrie, GA 31788 or online at registrar@southernregional.edu.

4. Submit acceptable Admission Placement Exam scores OR have successfully completed with a "C" or better transferable degree-level English and Math from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed. These courses must be equivalent to the entry-level English and Math required for our program. Acceptable admissions placement exams include: ACT, SAT, PSAT, ACCUPLACER (Classic and Next Generation), GED®, Georgia Milestones, HiSET®, HOPE GPA, COMPASS and ASSET. A student possessing an associate degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution will be exempt from the placement requirements.

Competitive admission requirements into the Practical Nursing Certificate program:

 \cdot All applicants accepted to SRTC (into the first phase of the PN program) are required to take and attain the required score or higher on an in-pereson Pre-Admission Assessment (TEAS) exam, prior to being accepted into the PN Program. The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is a timed exam that includes questions in the following areas: English, Math, Reading and Science.

 \cdot The SRTC Admission Office will only accept scores derived from testing conducted in an in-person testing environment. An in-person testing environment is one where the candidate's identity verification is performed through direct, face-to-face interaction without the reliance on web conferencing technologies.

 \cdot The PN program requires a minimum total adjusted individual TEAS score of 56%. Applicants are ranked by their scores with the highest scores filling available spots. Applicants have two opportunities (within a 12-month period) to achieve this score or higher and must submit these scores by the application deadline. Only the highest score of the two most recent attempts will be considered during ranking. We strongly recommend that anyone who does not pass the TEAS on their first try undertake remediation before their second attempt. Several copies of the 2024-2025 ATI TEAS Study Manual are in our SRTC Libraries. The TEAS study book can also be purchased online at https://atitesting.com/teas/study-manual.

• Applicants who fail to achieve the minimum TEAS score of 56% within two attempts will be ineligible for admission to the PN Program. However, they may reapply and retake the PN Pre-Admission exam after a one-year wait. Previous attempts will then be disregarded, allowing for new attempts to meet the required TEAS score. We strongly recommend any applicant within the one-year waiting period to complete the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Allied Health Professions (AAS) program.

\cdot The TEAS exam score is good for two years from the month and year of the exam.

<u>**Tiebreaker**</u>: In the event of a tie in the ranking, the student who has the highest average on the Math and Science sections of the qualifying TEAS exam will be given the remaining seat.

<u>NOTE</u>: Students will be required to complete health examinations and a Criminal Background report upon acceptance to the program. A current American Heart Association Health Care Provider BLS CPR card is required of all students entering the program. No other CPR cards will be accepted.



TEAS Pre-Admission Exam Practical Nursing Fall 2025 Program - Thomasville and Tifton Campuses Program Application Deadline: May 22, 2025

Once accepted to Southern Regional Technical College all PN applicants are required to take and attain the required score on the Pre-Admission Assessment (TEAS) exam, prior to being accepted into the Practical Nursing Program. The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is a timed exam that includes questions in the following area: English, Math, Reading and Science.

The total TEAS score requirement for the PN program is 56%. Students are allowed two (2) attempts within a 12-month period to make the program required score. If a second attempt is needed you will be required to take all sections of the exam.

You may register for the TEAS exam by calling or stopping by any of the SRTC Student Affairs offices. *The TEAS exam fee of \$75 must be paid prior to the exam.*
