Acceptance Procedures

To be admitted to the SRTC Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) LPN-RN Bridge Program you must meet admission requirements as outlined by the College. **NOTE: Admission to the program is academically competitive.** If needed, prospective students will be ranked by scores and the top candidates will be admitted to the Spring Semester 2021 (January 2021) class. Applications and admission requirements submitted after the posted deadlines will be held and reviewed for the next available class. Deadline for the January 2021 class is **Thursday, October 1, 2020**. Students will be notified by mail regarding their acceptance status once all file evaluations are complete. **Acceptance/Denial letters will be mailed out Friday, October 30, 2020.**

Admissions Requirements

1. Submit SRTC Admission Application and \$25 application fee. *(Returning students are not charged a fee).*
2. Submit proof of age. *(Must be 18 years or older at the time of program entry).* Either a valid state driver's license or birth certificate is acceptable.
3. Have **official** transcripts for high school diploma/GED **AND ALL** colleges and/or technical colleges (transferrable credit or not) mailed to the SRTC Registrar's Office; Southern Regional Technical College; 800 Veteran's Parkway North; Moultrie, GA 31788.
4. Submit a copy of an active unencumbered LPN License.
5. Have acceptable admission placement exam (APE) scores OR have successfully completed with a "C" or better transferable English and college algebra (college algebra must not be older than five (5) years) from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed. These courses must be equivalent to the entry-level English and math required for our Associate of Science in Nursing Program. If the college algebra class is over five years, you will be required to retake the college algebra course.
6. Meet the minimum prerequisite GPA requirement by the posted program deadline: A minimum GPA prerequisite of 2.8 is required in order to meet admission requirements for the program. If a prerequisite course has been taken twice, only the last attempt is counted for prerequisite GPA purposes. Successful completion of a prerequisite course means making a grade of "C" or better. *Note: A grade of "W" does count as an attempt.* Courses exempted and articulated do not carry points. The ASN Bridge Program prerequisite courses are as follows: **BIOL 2113, BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114, BIOL 2114L, BIOL 2117, BIOL 2117L, ENGL 1101, and MATH 1111, PSYC 1101, COMP 1000, one Humanities/Fine Arts courses and a general elective course.**

*****While a "C" is a passing transferrable grade, too many "C" grades will not give you a 2.8 prerequisite grade point average.*****

NOTE: BIOL 2113, BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114, BIOL 2114L, BIOL 2117, BIOL 2117L, and MATH 1111 will not be considered if completed more than 5 years before admission to the ASN Program. COMP 1000 will not be considered if completed more than 7 years before admission to the ASN Program.

7. All LPN – RN Bridge applicants are required to take and attain the required score on the ASN Pre-Admission Assessment (HESI) exam, prior to being accepted into the LPN-RN Bridge Program. The ASN Pre-Admission Assessment (HESI) exam is composed of the following sections: Math, Science (Anatomy and Physiology), English (Vocabulary, Grammar, and Reading Comprehension) and two Style/Profile sections. Applicants are strongly encouraged not to take the HESI exam until completing A&P I and II OR at least completing A&P I and some of A&P II. Applicants must also have a completed file prior to taking the HESI exam (excluding current college coursework).

Applicants will be allowed **two** attempts to pass the English, Math, and Science (Anatomy and Physiology) sections with a composite score of “75” on each section. Any applicant that is unsuccessful on the **first** HESI exam (in any section) is strongly encouraged to remediate prior to retaking that section(s) of the HESI exam. Several copies of the HESI Admission Assessment Exam Review, 4th Edition (ISBN# 978-0-323-35378-6) are on reserve in all SRTC Libraries for student use. However, the HESI review book is also available for purchase online at www.elsevier.com. The HESI exam score is good for two years from the month and year of the exam.

Any applicant that does not attain a composite score of “75” on one or more sections of the HESI assessment exam after **two** attempts will not be considered for admission into the ASN Program. However, applicants can reapply to the ASN Program and take the ASN Pre Admission exam again after waiting **one** year. At such time, the applicant will be allowed two attempts to meet the qualifying ASN Pre-Admission HESI Assessment exam scores.

8. **If an additional competitive process is necessary due to the number of qualified applications, the following additional point system will be used.**

Pre-requisite GPA:

- **3.7 – 4.0 : 90 points**
- **3.2 – 3.6 : 60 points**
- **2.8 – 3.1 : 30 points**
- **Associate Degree or higher – 10 points**

*****POSSIBLE TOTAL: 100 POINTS*****

NOTE: Students will be required to complete Health Examinations and a Criminal Background report upon acceptance to the program. A current American Heart Association Health Care Provider BLS CPR card is required of all students entering the program. No other CPR cards will be accepted.

All students are subject to the competitive admissions selection process for these programs. The number of students selected for any given semester is based on the number of available clinical slots in the program as a whole and may vary by campus and semester. However, slots are filled from the highest point total downward until the maximum enrollments are reached. There is no guarantee that a higher GPA will progress within a particular semester as all slots are competitive.

Tiebreaker: In the event of a tie in the ranking, the student’s current HESI score will be used as the tiebreaker. In the event that a student has taken the HESI exam more than once, the current HESI scores will be averaged and the average of the two scores will be used in the tiebreaker process.

Pre-Admission Testing ASN Bridge Spring 2021 (January 2021) Program – Thomasville Campus

You may register for the Pre-Admission ASN Assessment (HESI) exam by calling or stopping by any of the SRTC Student Affairs offices. Make sure you are ready to commit to the exam session you select. There is an exam time limit. *HESI exam fees must be paid prior to taking the exam.*

- Receipt of SRTC Admissions Application, application fee, and all official transcripts are required prior to taking this exam.
- A valid state issued picture ID is required to sit for the exam – NO EXCEPTIONS
- Arrive ½ hour to 1 hour early. NO ONE WILL BE ADMITTED AFTER POSTED TIME TO BEGIN EXAM SESSION.

ASN Generic exam schedule: Students are allowed two (2) attempts to pass this exam. If a retake exam is required, you will only need to take the section(s) of the exam which you did not meet the required score during your first attempt.

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Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) Bridge Program Student Checklist

Your SRTC admissions file must be complete prior to acceptance into the Associate of Science in Nursing Program. The following checklist is provided for your personal use to help you ensure your file is complete by the posted deadline.

___ Complete SRTC Admission Application and pay the \$25 Application fee (*if not previously paid*). Applications are available at the SRTC Student Affairs office and online through the college website: www.southernregional.edu. Click on the APPLY NOW (blue bar – top of screen) - choose SRTC Application Apply Online to complete the online application. You can also apply by clicking on the SRTC Application – printable version.

___ Provide Proof of Age and Lawful Presence Verification (i.e., Birth Certificate or Driver's License).

___ Submit a copy of an active unencumbered LPN License.

___ Have acceptable admission placement exam scores OR have successfully completed with a "C" or better transferable English and college algebra (college algebra must not be older than five (5) years) from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed. These courses must be the equivalent to the entry-level English and math required for the ASN Program. If the college algebra class is over five years, you will be required to retake the college algebra course. Acceptable Admissions Placement Exams (APE) include: ACT, SAT, PSAT, ACCUPLACER, (Classic and Next Generation), COMPASS and ASSET.

___ Provide an **official** copy of your high school transcript or GED transcript to any SRTC Admissions office.

___ Provide an **official** copy of **ALL** college and/or technical college transcripts to: SRTC Registrar's Office; 800 Veterans Parkway North; Moultrie, GA 31788.

___ Complete all prerequisite courses required for the program. Prerequisite courses are listed in the ASN LPN-RN Bridge competitive admission requirement booklet and on LPN-RN Bridge Student Advisement sheets. ASN LPN-RN Bridge competitive admission requirement booklets can be obtained from the SRTC Student Affairs office and SRTC ASN faculty. Curriculum requirements are also listed on our College website – click on *View All Programs* – then click on *Associate of Science in Nursing (LPN-RN Bridge)*.

Remember: Prerequisite GPA requirement must be at least 2.8.

___ Take the Pre-Admission ASN Bridge Assessment (HESI) Exam. The exam covers: English, Math and Anatomy and Physiology. Additional HESI exam information is available on the SRTC – Associate of Science in Nursing (LPN-RN Bridge) program webpage. You may also call the SRTC Student Affairs office at 229-225-5060 or contact SRTC ASN faculty for more details.

2. Collect Documents – Collect all necessary financial documents. Examples include Federal Tax Returns, W-2s, 1099s, unemployment statements and untaxed income statements such as child support payments. Students are required to provide their financial information on the FAFSA and, if applicable, information from their spouse, parent or step-parent.

3. Create a FAFSA User ID and Password – All students should create a FAFSA user ID and password. Visit www.fsaaid.ed.gov to create your ID. Please make a note of your FAFSA user ID and password as you will need this information each time you login. For dependent students, both the student and a parent need a FAFSA User ID and password to electronically sign the FAFSA.

4. Visit www.fafsa.gov to complete your FAFSA, select the correct School Year – Once you have created your user ID and password, you can begin the application. Refer to the chart in Step 1 to ensure you select the correct school year for the terms you wish to attend. When you are presented with the option to retrieve your IRS tax data, we strongly encourage you to USE THIS OPTION, which will populate your FAFSA with the tax data on file with the IRS. This may significantly reduce the time necessary to finalize your financial aid award. Dependent students should use the option for themselves and their parents. However, not all students can use the IRS data retrieval tool for a variety of different reasons, so if you are unable to use the IRS data retrieval tool, you would need to manually enter your tax data as it appears on your tax form. **SRTC’s school code is 005615** for all locations.

Do I need to provide parent information?

If you can answer “Yes” to one of the questions below, you do NOT need parent information to complete your FAFSA.

Are you 24 years of age?

Are you married?

Are you a veteran?

Do you have legal dependents that you financially support?

If you cannot answer “Yes” to one of the above questions, you MUST have parental information to complete your FAFSA. If extenuating circumstances exist where parental information is unavailable, the dependent student should contact the Financial Aid Office.

Contact the Financial Aid Office for Priority Dates.

Note: All required financial aid documents must be submitted by the Priority Dates. Financial Aid applications/documents submitted after priority dates will be processed, but funds may not be available on the first day of classes to apply towards tuition or to purchase books. Students submitting financial aid applications after priority date should be prepared to self-pay fees. Once financial aid is awarded, students may be eligible for reimbursement.
