On January 13, 2022, the Georgia Board of Nursing Program (GBON) Approval for SRTC-PN program was changed from Full Approval to Conditional Approval per Board rule 410-9-.11(2)(c) and 410-9-.12 (2)(g) due to program four-year pass rate of 75.64% for first time test takers from 2018-2021. The approval status will be reevaluated following the review of the NCLEX results by the board in January 2023. *Note: For students newly enrolled as of Fall 2022 or Spring 2023 with potential program completion in Summer 2023 (for Fall 2022 start) or December 2023 (for Spring 2023 start): should the Georgia Board of Nursing determine in January 2023 to withdraw program approval then the GBON may require the transfer of remaining students to other nursing programs to complete the program of study.*

Practical Nursing Competitive Admission Procedures

For admission into the occupational courses of the SRTC Practical Nursing Program, requirements as outlined by the College must be met. Admission to the program is academically competitive. Please note that compliance with the admission criteria does not guarantee admission. Admission requirements and criteria are developed by the Practical Nursing faculty per the Georgia Board of Nursing and applied by the college's Admissions department to select those candidates for admission as described. Applicants are ranked according to the admission criteria to determine which applicants demonstrate potential for program success.

If needed, prospective students will be ranked by several factors and the top candidates will be admitted to the semester cohort.

Admissions Requirements:

- 1. Submit a SRTC admission application and pay the one-time \$25 application fee. Applications are available online through the college website: <u>www.southernregional.edu/how-to-apply.</u>
- 2. Submit proof of age. (*Must be 18 years or older at the time of program entry*). Either a valid state driver's license or birth certificate is acceptable.
- 3. Submit **official** transcripts for high school diploma/GED® **AND all** colleges and/or technical colleges (transferrable credit or not) mailed to the SRTC Registrar's Office; Southern Regional Technical College, 800 Veteran's Parkway North, Moultrie, GA 31788 or online at registrar@southernregional.edu.
- 4. Submit acceptable admission placement exam scores OR have successfully completed with a "C" or better transferable degree-level English and Math from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed. These courses must be equivalent to the entry-level English and Math required for our program. Acceptable admissions placement exams include: ACT, SAT, PSAT, ACCUPLACER (Classic and Next Generation), GED®, Georgia Milestones, HiSET®, HOPE GPA, COMPASS and ASSET. A student possessing an associate degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution will be exempt from the placement requirements.

Competitive admission requirements into the Practical Nursing diploma program:

The **highlighted** pre-requisite courses must have a 2.8 GPA. *Math and Science (ALHS) courses must be completed within **five** years of the first PN course are as follows:

- ENGL1010 Fundamentals of English (3 hours)
- *MATH 1012 Foundations of Mathematics (3 hours)
- *ALHS 1011 Structure & Function of the Human Body (5 hours)

*BIOL 2113/2113L & BIOL 2114/2114L may substitute for ALHS 1011 (8 hours)

- *ALHS 1090 Introduction to Medical Terminology (2 hours)
- PSYC 1010 Introduction to Psychology
- COLL 1500 College Success
- All six courses must be completed or transcripts received by the end of Summer Semester (prior to Fall start) or the end of Fall Semester (prior to Spring start).

Exemption credit is not calculated. If a course is repeated, last grade attempt is used in the calculation.

Rule: A student cannot have more than <u>one</u> unsuccessful attempt in the same course.

5. All PN applicants are required to take and attain the required score on the PN Pre-Admission Assessment (HESI) exam, prior to being accepted into the PN Program. The HESI exam is composed of the following sections: Math, Science (Anatomy and Physiology), and English (Vocabulary, Grammar, and Reading Comprehension). Applicants are strongly encouraged not to take the HESI exam until completing the Diploma-Level ALHS 1011 or the Degree-Level A&P I and II. Applicants must also have a completed admissions file prior to taking the HESI exam (excluding <u>current</u> college coursework).

Applicants will be allowed <u>two</u> attempts to pass the English, Math, and Science (Anatomy and Physiology) sections with a composite score of "78" on each section. Any applicant that is unsuccessful on the first HESI exam (in any section) is strongly encouraged to remediate prior to retaking that section(s) of the HESI exam. Several copies of the <u>HESI Admission Assessment Exam Review</u>, 5th Edition (ISBN# <u>9780323582261</u>) are on reserve in all SRTC Libraries for student use. However, the HESI review book is also available for purchase online at <u>www.elsevier.com</u>.

Any applicant that does not attain a composite score of "78" on all sections of the HESI assessment exam after <u>two</u> attempts will not be considered for admission into the Practical Nursing Program.

Applicants may reapply to the PN Program and take the HESI exam again after waiting <u>one</u> year. At such time, the applicant will be allowed two attempts to meet the qualifying HESI exam scores.

The HESI exam score is good for two years from the month and year of the exam.

6. Applicants are subject to the competitive admissions selection process for these programs. The number of applicants admitted for any given semester is based on the number of available clinical spaces in the program as a whole and may vary by campus and semester.

If an additional competitive process is necessary due to the number of qualified applications, the following process will be used: Students will be ranked from highest to lowest based on the student's HESI total score. (Applicants are allowed two attempts to take the HESI – calculations will be made using the sum of the highest English, Math, and Anatomy and Physiology scores).

Tiebreaker: In the event of a tie in the ranking, the student with the highest GPA will be used.

<u>NOTE</u>: Students will be required to complete health examinations and a Criminal Background report upon acceptance to the program. A current American Heart Association Health Care Provider BLS CPR card is required of all students entering the program. No other CPR cards will be accepted.

All six courses must be completed, or transcripts received by the end of Summer semester (prior to Fall start) or the end of Fall Semester (prior to Spring start).

Ranking:

If an additional competitive process is necessary due to the number of qualified applications, the following process will be used: Students will be ranked from highest to lowest based on the student's HESI total score. (Applicants are allowed two attempts to take the HESI – calculations will be made using the sum of the highest English, Math, and Anatomy and Physiology scores).

Tiebreaker: In the event of a tie in the ranking, the student with the highest GPA will be used.

Health Sciences Rule:

Must successfully complete with a minimum grade of "C" all core required in the Practical Nursing major within two attempts. Grades of "D, F, and W" are considered unsuccessful attempts. All academic history within the last two years, whether on campus or as a transfer student, will be considered when evaluating the number of attempts.

A minimum grade minimum grade of "C" is required in all core within two attempts. If a student has two unsuccessful attempts, he/she will be withdrawn from the program and may reapply after a period of two years.

The requirements for admission into the specific courses for the Practical Nursing Program exceed the requirements for general admission into the college. This program prepares its graduates for licensure under the guidelines of the Georgia Board of Nursing. Therefore, the criteria utilized for the competitive admission of students were chosen as a means to increase the opportunities for success not only in the PN program, but also for licensure and future employment. Program Completion:

Students must complete the PN program within 18 months of enrollment in PNSG 2030 (Nursing Fundamentals).

<u>Age at time of entry</u>: Must be 18 years of age at the time of program entry. Applicant for licensure; examination, temporary permits is at least 18 years of age. (O.C.G.A & 43-26 Nurse Practice Act: 43-26-36)

Applicants are subject to the competitive admissions selection process for these programs. The number of applicants admitted for any given semester is based on the number of available clinical spaces in the program as a whole and may vary by campus and semester.

I understand that if I vary from the prescribed course sequence listed above, I may be unable to graduate within the regular program length and may not be able to schedule courses as needed.
